UPGRADE CONSIDERATIONS

The latest DashBoard upgrade considerations and important notices are listed below.

IMPORTANT NOTICE for CUSTOMERS with ROSS VIDEO SERVERS

DEPENDENCY REQUIREMENT FOR 64-BIT WINDOWS

- If you are using the <browser/> tag on DashBoard running on a 64-bit Windows operating system, Microsoft's WebView2 Runtime must be present on the system. If it is not already installed, download it from the following link: <https://developer.microsoft.com/en-us/microsoft-edge/webview2/>

SUPPORT FOR 32-BIT OPERATING SYSTEMS

- DashBoard 9.5 and later will no longer be distributed on 32-bit operating systems.

ROLE-BASED ACCESS CONTROL REQUIREMENTS

- If you are using an RPM Server that is secured with HTTPS, future DashBoard upgrades will require manually adding the RPM Server certificate to DashBoard after the installation process is complete. The upgrade procedure can be found in the DashBoard Role-Based Access Control Guide (8351DR-04A-xxx).

VERSION 9.15.1 – SEPTEMBER 2025

WHAT'S NEW

- **ABILITY TO DECRYPT EXTERNAL APIS**

DashBoard can now ingest encrypted external APIs and script files. This means that CustomPanel developers are now able to decrypt external panel dependency files when developing new CustomPanels.

- **OTHER IMPROVEMENTS**

View-only users are no longer able to remove RPM from the tree view.

BUGS ADDRESSED

- Fixed an issue where the NDI Panel's setImageWindow arguments were named incorrectly. (DASH-5350)
- Fixed an issue where users could not scroll horizontally on Ultritouch devices. (DASH-5376)

WHAT'S NEW

• PTZ CAMERA CONTROLLER ENHANCEMENTS

Support for Sony BRC-AM7 Camera

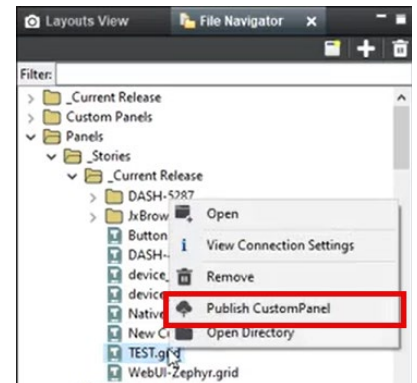
- Store and recall of presets both locally from DashBoard storage and from camera storage (note that when using DashBoard storage, only pan, tilt, zoom and focus will be stored and recalled).
- Direct control of pan, tilt, zoom and focus.
- Basic paint control, such as:
 - Iris control, Iris can be opened and closed, but position cannot be viewed or set directly.
 - Gain and shutter can be switched between automatic and manual mode, but cannot be set or viewed through DashBoard.
 - Full control of ND filter.
 - Set white balance mode and adjust red gain, blue gain and color temperature.
- VISCA gateway to enable control of a Sony BRC-AM7 camera from a serial VISCA controller such as Carbonite.
- Furio gateway to enable control of a Sony BRC-AM7 Camera from a controller using the Furio API, such as SmartShell.
- Integration with DashBoard tally service to monitor and display the camera tally state.

Support for Panasonic Digest Authentication

Note: Before enabling Digest Authentication for Panasonic PTZ cameras already added to DashBoard, set the Username and Password for the camera on all DashBoard clients on the Config>Camera page. Enabling authentication before doing this can cause the camera to freeze up requiring a hard reset.

• PUBLISH CUSTOMPANELS TO RPM DIRECTLY FROM DASHBOARD

Users can now publish CustomPanels to RPM directly from within DashBoard's File Navigator by right clicking on the CustomPanel file and selecting Publish CustomPanel.



- **WILDCARD SUPPORT FOR PARAMS ONCHANGE EVENT WITH OID ATTRIBUTE IN OGSCRIPT**

The OID attribute in ogScript now supports wildcards for the params onchange event, enabling tasks to be triggered on multiple parameters which share a pattern.

- **SERVICE PANEL SUPPORT FOR ULTRITOUCH/FR12 DOOR**

Implemented support for product provided 'Service Panels' for Ultritouch/FR12 Door.

BUGS ADDRESSED

- Fixed an issue where PTZ camera axis inputs sent through the Furio gateway caused the camera to continue to drift when the connection unexpectedly ended. (CI-942)
- Fixed an issue with XPression devices disappearing from the Basic Tree View and losing connection after DashBoard restarts. (DASH-5272)
- Fixed an issue where grids within Matrix panels would fail to load properly when first opened. (DASH-5274)
- Fixed an issue where the cursor would be unresponsive in source code windows and OGScript windows. (DASH-5285)
- Fixed an issue where MIDI controller connections with DashBoard would fail to sync properly with Carbonite Audio Mixer faders. (DASH-5287)
- Fixed an issue with parameter descriptor updates. (DASH-5288)

WHAT'S NEW

- **WEBCAM VIDEO FEED WIDGET**

The DashBoard OGLML library now features a new <webcam> tag. This enhancement allows for seamlessly integrating any native webcam video feed directly into your custom control panels. This feature unlocks the full potential of the Carbonite Solo series by seamlessly integrating its USB-C webcam output with DashBoard. Use of the <webcam> tag is supported on Windows and Linux devices. Mac is not currently supported.

BUGS ADDRESSED

- Fixed an issue where the floating navigation button would disappear when the web browser was set to Chromium. (DASH-5211)
- Fixed an issue where the XML parser was causing errors that lead to CustomPanels failing to load. (DASH-5194)
- Fixed an issue where refreshing an Ultrix device would occasionally lead to the UI getting stuck on the “Building” screen. (DASH-5188)
- Fixed an issue where Ultrix device UIs would take longer than expected to build. (DASH-5187)
- Fixed an issue where exceptions in the script table for Ultrix devices could cause issues with loading the UI. (DASH-5186)
- Fixed an issue where Ultrix device UIs would load, even if the device was offline or rebooting. (DASH-5184)
- Fixed an issue where the HTTP read timeout would cause Ultrix UIs to not load. (DASH-5176)
- Fixed an issue where text selection/highlighting was inconsistent in the source editor. (DASH-5175)
- Fixed an issue where fixed an issue where rebooting an OSG card would sometimes cause the configuration to be cleared. (DASH-5151)

WHAT'S NEW

- **PTZ CAMERA CONTROLLER ENHANCEMENTS**

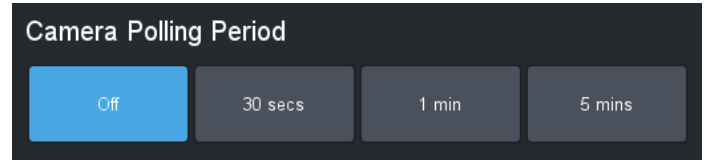
- **Support for Panasonic AW-UE160 and AW-HR140 Cameras**

- Store and recall of presets both locally from DashBoard storage and from camera storage.
- Direct control of pan, tilt, zoom and focus.
- Basic paint control, such as:
 - Iris control. Note the AW-HR140 does not provide an F-stop value to display.
 - Gain, Shutter, and ND Filter control, though only the Shutter Step can be controlled through DashBoard.
 - White balance mode, and adjusting red gain, blue gain, and color temperature. The AW-UE160 also supports adjusting green gain.
 - The AW-UE160 also supports setting the red, blue, and green gain for the AWB A and AWB B white balance modes.
- VISCA gateway to enable control of a Panasonic PTZ camera from a serial VISCA controller such as Carbonite.
- Furio gateway to enable control of a Panasonic PTZ Camera from a controller using the Furio API, such as SmartShell.
- Integration with DashBoard tally service to monitor and display the camera tally state. Note that the AW-HR140 does not have a tally light on the camera itself.
- The AW-HR140 includes Wiper control which can be accessed from the Presets, PTZ, and Config pages of the UI.

Note: If you are already controlling an AW-UE160 in DashBoard using the AW-UE150 controller and wish to switch to the new AW-UE160 controller, see the [Transferring Panasonic AW-UE150 Presets to an AW-UE160 \(8351DR-018-9.1\) app note](#) for instructions as to how to transfer your existing presets.

PTZ Polling

An option to turn on periodic polling for PTZ cameras so that changes made to the camera by controllers other than DashBoard can be reflected in the DashBoard UI. This feature generates a lot of message traffic, so is disabled by default. If using during regular operation, test in your environment to ensure that the message traffic is not disrupting other controllers talking to the cameras. Camera polling is not supported for the Pivot-SE.



BUGS ADDRESSED

- Fixed an issue where modifications to the database could lead to the Java Runtime Environment encountering a fatal error. (DASH-5133)

VERSION 9.12.0 – DECEMBER 2024

WHAT'S NEW

- **CATENA SUPPORT**

DashBoard 9.12 now supports a beta version of Catena standard. Catena is a new standard that makes it easy to secure, connect and control a multi-vendor ecosystem of on premises and cloud-based media processing services and microservices.

Catena Devices

Catena devices can now be operated within DashBoard.

OAuth 2.0 Login

Users can now configure OAuth 2.0 login settings within the DashBoard Preferences. Once configured, users can log in via OAuth 2.0 either through a browser on the same device or by using another device with a camera to scan a QR code.

By setting up OAuth 2.0 login, it can be used as an authorization tool to control which functions a user can perform. Administrators can define user profiles with specific scopes, granting different levels of access to perform various functions.

Multi-Language Support

Catena devices can be run with the parameter names displayed in English, French, or Spanish. If the language selection is changed within the INI file, the panel must be closed and reopened for the translation to take effect.

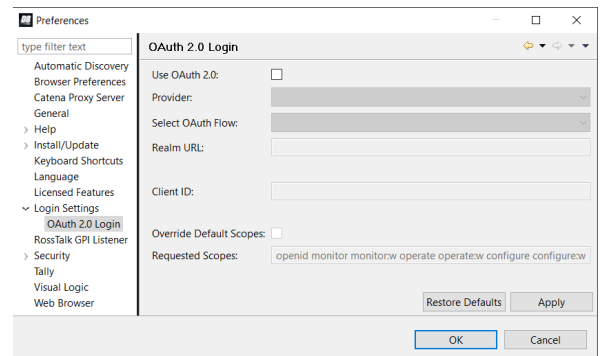
OID Alias Support

All parameters can now have OID aliases which can be added at any time. Previously, a side-loaded XML file defining all aliases was required, and they were only usable by parameters with integer OIDs.

- **CUSTOMPANEL LICENSING IMPROVEMENTS**

Various improvements relating to CustomPanel licensing including:

- The **Host Name** field on the Software Based Licensing tab under Preferences > Licensed Features is now validated to prevent users from being able to add an invalid value.
- UI improvements under Preferences > Licensed Features.



OAuth 2.0 Login

Users are now able to configure OAuth 2.0 login settings within DashBoard Preferences.

- **JDK AND JXBROWSER UPDATES**

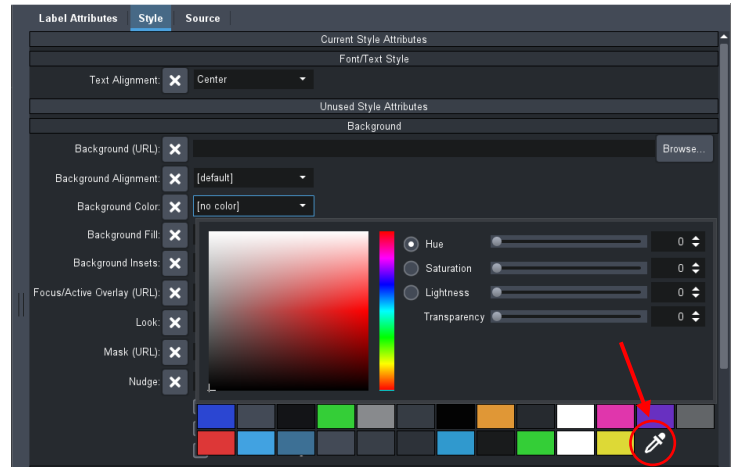
JxBrowser has been updated from version 7.37.1 to version 7.41.3.

The Java Development Kit has been updated to the latest version of Azul Zulu on Windows and Linux. Note that on MacOS, the Java Development Kit being used is still a previous version, 8u362.

- **OTHER ENHANCEMENTS**

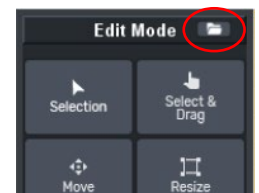
- On Windows devices, users can now use the Eyedropper tool to select a color from any visible screen when selecting a color for something in a CustomPanel.

Note that the Eyedropper tool is disabled if the scale does not match for all displays being used. If the Eyedropper icon does not appear on your Windows device, go to Windows Settings > System > Display and ensure all displays have the same scale.



Eyedropper Tool

- A confirmation dialog now displays when exiting the DashBoard Proxy Server.
- A CustomPanel File Location button is now located at the top right of the Edit Mode toolbar. This button opens the exact location of the source file for an open CustomPanel.
- Users can now use both "." and "/" separators when looking up parameters. Previously, only "." separators could be used.
- Graphics can now be directly embedded into a CustomPanel using the <externalobjects> tag using two new attributes: **encoding** and **zip**.

BUGS ADDRESSED

- Fixed an issue where the Ultriscape Layout Editor for Ultrix would render incorrectly on Mac devices. (DASH-5127)

- **PTZ CAMERA CONTROLLER ENHANCEMENTS**

- **Support for Ross PTZ-12G+**

- The PTZ Camera Controller in DashBoard now supports the new Ross PTZ-12G+ camera. The PTZ-12G+ controller includes all the existing features for the Ross PTZ-12G and PTZ-NDI.

- **PTZ Motion Sync Support for Ross PTZ Cameras**

- Enabling and disabling **PTZ Motion Sync** has been added to the **Config -> Camera -> Camera Options** panel for Ross PTZ-12G+, PTZ-12G, and PTZ-NDI cameras. Enabling Motion Sync means that pan, tilt, and zoom axes will be synchronized when recalling presets that are stored on the camera. Presets stored locally in DashBoard will still be recalled on a per-axis basis.

- **All Audio Controls Enabled for Ross PTZ-NDI Cameras**

- All audio controls have been made available for PTZ-NDI cameras since **NDI|HX** video can be disabled in the web interface, and this allows **Audio Delay** and **Audio Encoding/Sample Rate** to be set. These controls will have no effect if **NDI|HX** is enabled on the camera.

VERSION 9.9.1 – APRIL 2024

BUGS ADDRESSED

WHAT'S NEW

- **CUSTOMPANEL LICENSING ENHANCEMENTS**

Software Based Licensing

Added the ability to license CustomPanels and built-in camera plugins using Ross Platform Manager or Ross Video Online Activation. The Software Based Licensing tab is accessed via **Window > Preferences > Licensed Features**, and displays any licensed product keys and associated features along with their information.

Grace Period for Licensed Features

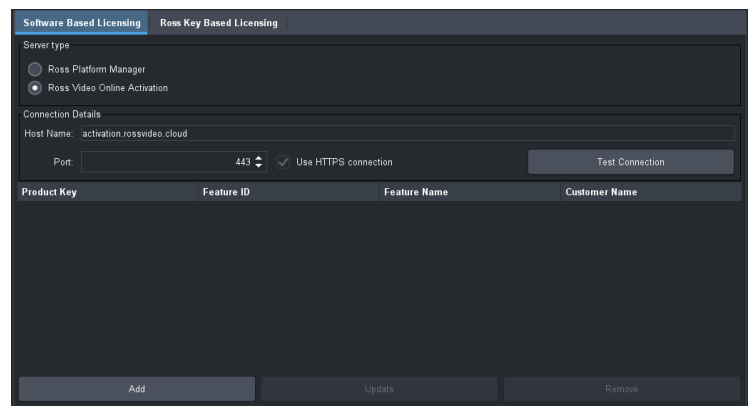
Each CustomPanel has a grace period of 7 days that will allow the licensed feature to continue working if DashBoard can no longer connect to the licensing server. If DashBoard does not regain a connection to the licensing server within the 7 day grace period, the licensed feature will be disabled until DashBoard can verify the licenses validity. Note that tampering with the system clock of your computer will automatically end the grace period.

Connectivity Issues Notification

If DashBoard loses connection to the licensing server (either Ross Platform Manager or Ross Video Online Activation) a notification will appear in the title bar alerting the user that the connection has been lost.

Ultritouch Support

Users are also able to use Software Based Licensing in Ultritouch mode.



Software Based Licensing

Users can now license CustomPanels using Ross Platform Manager and Ross Video Online Activation.

Continued Ross Key Based Licensing Support

Ross Key Based Licensing is still supported and upgrading to DashBoard 9.9 will not cause previously licensed features to become unlicensed.

When accessing an unlicensed Ross Key Based feature previously, the licensing page would display immediately and allow for the user to configure the licensing details. Now, an error message will display in place of the licensed feature, and you will need to configure the licensing details on the Ross Keys Based Licensing tab (accessed via **Window > Preferences > Licensed Features**).

- **ROSTALK ENHANCEMENT**

Added a new RossTalk.sendMessage function that users can use to send multiple RossTalk messages simultaneously.

- **PTZ CAMERA CONTROLLER ENHANCEMENTS**

Preset Validation

A new option has been added to the PTZ Camera Controller for Sony and Panasonic cameras to allow disabling of Preset Validation. Preset Validation ensures that all required data has been collected before storing a preset, but can cause problems when trying to use the PTZ Camera controller with camera models that are not explicitly supported. When Preset Validation is disabled, DashBoard will store a preset even if all required data has not been collected, without failing or showing a warning. It is the responsibility of the user to ensure that all necessary data has been stored so that the preset can be recalled satisfactorily.

BUGS ADDRESSED

- Fixed an issue where DashBoard would become unresponsive when scrolling on Ultrix SoftPanels on a Mac device. (DASH-4816)
- Fixed an issue where the selected row in License Management on Ultritouch would appear white. (DASH-4749)
- Fixed an issue where folder nodes would sometimes appear as draggable leaf nodes when searched in Visual Logic sidepanels. (DASH-4697)
- Fixed an issue where the DashBoard and Ross Video logos would display upside down on launch on MacOS 14.1. (DASH-4671)
- Fixed an issue where DashBoard would become unresponsive when opening Device UIs, CustomPanels, and the Preferences menu on certain installations of MacOS. (DASH-4670)

WHAT'S NEW

- **CONTEXT MENU AVAILABLE FOR JXBROWSER**

Added a context menu that appears when a JxBrowser element widget is right clicked. The context menu allows you to navigate backwards and forwards, refresh the page, and access dev-tools through the Inspect option.

- **OTHER ENHANCEMENTS**

- Updated JxBrowser binaries used to address security vulnerabilities.
- Updated ogScript palette to include missing ogScript functions.
- Right clicking an element while in PanelBuilder Edit Mode now allows you to delete the selected element.

- **PTZ CAMERA CONTROLLER ENHANCEMENTS**

Support for Canon CR-X300

The PTZ Camera Controller in DashBoard now supports the Canon CR-X300 camera. The CR-X300 controller includes all the features included in the Canon CR-N300 and CR-N500 camera controllers added in DashBoard 9.5, but also adds support for the camera wiper functionality. Wiper control is available on the Presets and PTZ pages of the UI.

To control the camera wiper from DashBoard, it is necessary to configure an HTTP connection to the camera in addition to the VISCA connection. Once you have added the camera, go to the Config->Camera page to configure the HTTP connection, and enable wiper control.

Support Confirm Control Takeover in SmartShell 6.1a

SmartShell 6.1a includes a new feature to show a dialog prompt before taking control of a robot from another client. This release upgrades the Furio Gateway for PTZ Camera Control to enable the Confirm Control Takeover feature to be used when controlling PTZ cameras

from SmartShell. Changes add the ability to support station names and to request, rather than force, takeover of joystick control.

Set port when adding a Panasonic AW-UE150 Camera

The Add New Camera wizard for the Panasonic AW-UE150 now offers an option to set a port other than 80. The port selected must match the port configured on the camera itself. Note that it is not possible to change the port for a camera already added to DashBoard – the camera must be removed and re-added with the new port. Contact Ross technical support for assistance with transferring presets and other camera settings when removing and re-adding a camera to change the port.

The ability to set the port for a Panasonic AW-UE150 Camera is now supported on Ultritouch mode.

Additional paint parameters for Sony BRC-X1000

Extra paint parameters have been added to the Sony BRC-X1000 camera controller for use in custom panels. These parameters are not exposed in the PTZ Camera UI.



BUGS ADDRESSED

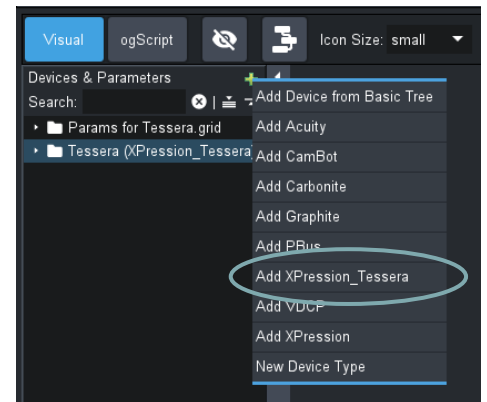

Blind Recall of presets not stored in DashBoard

This option can be found in the **Operation** tab of the **Config** page.

Store Presets on Camera

The **Manage Presets on Camera** setting has been renamed to **Store Presets on Camera** but is functionally the same.

Indication when presets will be stored or recalled from camera storage

The presets page of the PTZ Camera Controller for all camera models has been enhanced to indicate which presets are linked to presets stored on the camera, and when storing and recalling will use camera storage.

- In **panel** mode
 - Store button text will change to **Store on Camera** to indicate when a preset will be stored both on the camera and locally.
 - Recall button text will change to **Recall From Camera** to indicate a preset will be recalled from camera storage.
 - Shading indicates presets that currently don't have data stored in DashBoard but are linked to camera storage.
- In **shotbox** mode
 - In **Recall** mode, purple shading will indicate any presets with no data stored locally where **Blind Shot Recall** from camera is available.
 - In **Store** mode, yellow shading will indicate any presets with no data stored locally, where storing will cause data to be stored on camera as well as locally.

Color temperature slider for Panasonic AW-UE150

The PTZ Camera Controller for the Panasonic AW-UE150 now includes a slider to set the color temperature of the camera when it is in VAR mode.

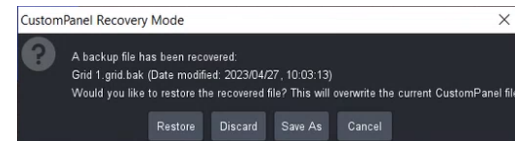

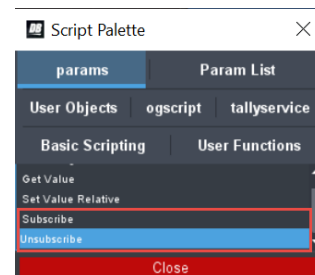


Auto-Subscribe option in ogScript Editor

Furio Gateway for PTZ Camera Controllers

The Furio gateway that allows controllers using the Furio API, such as SmartShell, to control PTZ Cameras through DashBoard has a few new features:

- The value of ZoomVar reported in SmartShell for the pan and tilt axes now reflects whether the variable zoom setting on the PTZ Camera is ON (zoomVar reported as 100) or OFF (zoomVar reported as 0). For cameras that don't support Variable Zoom and for other axes, the value will be reported as 50. This value is read only and cannot be set from SmartShell or other Furio controllers.
- The Furio Gateway now reports when the camera has moved away from a recalled preset through direct control of the pan, tilt, zoom or focus axes. 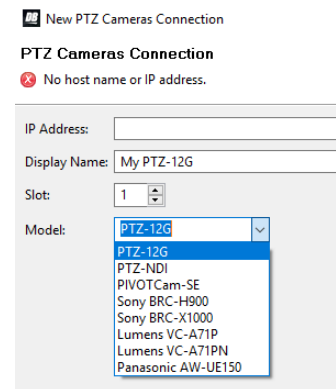

The PTZ Camera Controller in DashBoard now supports the new Ross PTZ-12G and PTZ-NDI cameras. To add a PTZ camera to DashBoard, navigate to **File > New > Other > Cameras** and select **PTZ Cameras**. Select the camera from the list of available models.

The PTZ-12G and PTZ-NDI Camera Controllers within DashBoard allow you to:

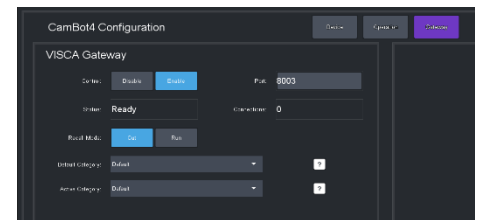
- **Store, recall and manage presets** — This feature provides access to the 256 stored presets available on the camera itself, as well as presets stored locally on the DashBoard computer.

- **Directly control pan, tilt, zoom, focus and iris** — Use the DashBoard UI or an external USB HID joystick connected to the DashBoard computer to control these settings. You can also set the digital zoom limit for the camera and store and recall it with presets stored locally in DashBoard.
- **Perform basic paint control** — Use the DashBoard UI or an external USB HID joystick connected to the DashBoard computer to perform basic paint control.
- **View and configure selected camera settings** — You can view these settings and access the camera’s on-screen configuration menu.
- **Use the VISCA gateway to control your PTZ camera from a VISCA over TCP controller (such as Carbonite)** — You can use the gateway to directly control pan, tilt, zoom and focus as well as to store and recall presets both locally on the DashBoard machine and from on-camera storage.
- **Use the Furio gateway to control your PTZ camera from a controller using the Furio API (such as SmartShell)** — You can use the gateway to directly control the pan, tilt, zoom and focus on the camera as well as to store, recall and manage presets and banks.
- **Use the DashBoard tally service to monitor and display the camera tally state** — In addition to tally services, you can also set the tally light on the camera itself.

- **VISCA GATEWAY FOR PT HEAD CONTROL PLUGIN**

The Ross PT Head Controller in DashBoard now includes a VISCA gateway feature. To configure and enable the gateway, select the **Config** option within the DashBoard control panel for the PT Head and look for the new **Gateway** button.

The VISCA gateway provides basic control of a Ross PT Head from a VISCA over TCP controller (such as a Carbonite). The VISCA gateway allows you to:

- **Directly control pan, tilt, zoom, and focus** — Control these settings directly from the PT Head of the controller.
- **Store and recall presets using the external ID of the preset as the reference** — Configuration settings in the gateway allow you to determine whether recalling presets through the gateway should trigger a cut or a run and to set the categories on the PT Head to use when storing and recalling presets.

- **CONTROL OF LUMENS VC-A71P & VC-A71PN CAMERAS**

The PTZ Camera Controller in DashBoard now supports Lumens PTZ Cameras with model numbers VC-A71P and VC-A71PN. This controller offers many of the same features as the PTZ-12G & PTZ-NDI controllers, apart from a few camera settings which are not supported through VISCA by the Lumens camera. It does not include a digital zoom limit, and the variable zoom feature (to determine whether the pan & tilt velocity should vary as the zoom changes).

- **LICENSING REQUIREMENTS**

- A PTZ Camera license is required to use DashBoard to control these cameras.

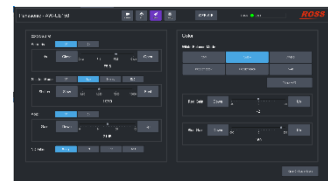

UPGRADE CONSIDERATIONS

• LAUNCHING DASHBOARD ON MACOS BIG SUR

- Upgrading to macOS Big Sur, version 11.0.1 or later, is not recommended if you are running DashBoard version 9.2 or earlier. Using macOS Big Sur may cause issues when launching the DashBoard application. You can use one of the workaround methods listed below:

To Launch DashBoard using Finder

- Navigate to the DashBoard installation directory. Click the Finder icon in the Dock and under **Applications** click **DashBoard.app** and select **Show Package Contents**. Then you can navigate to the **Contents > MacOS >** and run **PermissionDashBoard**.

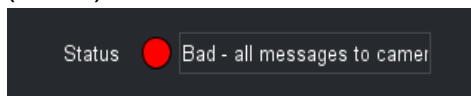
To Launch DashBoard using Terminal

- Enter this CLI command in Terminal. Note: this directory path assumes that you have installed DashBoard in the default installation directory.

BUGS ADDRESSED

- The camera controller for ACID and Hitachi cameras was not setting the green tally light on the camera when the DashBoard UI was displaying it as being on. This has now been resolved and green tally light should be correctly displayed on the camera. (CI-371)
- If the DashBoard PTZ Camera Controller was connecting to a camera that was mostly unresponsive, the UI would continue to show a progress bar displaying message “Reading camera settings” that would remain stuck at 99%. Behavior has now been changed so that the progress bar will now show “Waiting for camera to power on”. After 2 minutes, the progress bar will disappear and an error flag will be set so that the status of the camera is shown as “Bad - all messages to camera resulting in errors”, as shown below. If you see this error, please check the operation of your camera. For PIVOTCam-SE cameras, this can sometimes occur if the VISCA options in the On-Screen Display are incorrectly configured. (CI-278)



- When using SmartShell to control a PTZ Camera through the DashBoard Furio Gateway, the displayed focus position was not being updated when the camera focus was adjusted using either SmartShell or the DashBoard UI. This was caused by the PTZ Camera Controller failing

to request the new focus position after the focus axis had stopped moving and has now been resolved (CI-433).

- When using SmartShell to control a PTZ Camera through the DashBoard Furio Gateway, requesting a ZOOMVAR value of 0 for any axis would trigger a SmartShell error “BADDYNAMICRATIOARG”. This has now been corrected so that a value of 0 will be accepted. Note that the SmartShell ZOOMVAR function is not supported by the Furio gateway and so will have no effect on axis sensitivity. To change pan and tilt axis sensitivity as the zoom value changes, use the “Variable Zoom” option in the DashBoard camera panel (CI-434).

External ID Management

The Ross PT Head controller allows you to assign a numerical ID to each preset, which can be useful for automation or when creating custom panels. Version 9.1 adds several enhancements to the basic external ID functionality:

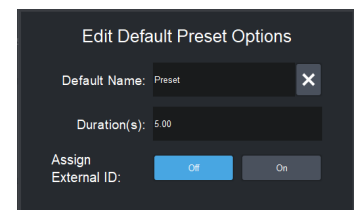
- **External ID Uniqueness:**

DashBoard will now ensure that all external IDs assigned to presets through DashBoard are unique, enforced either by category or by device, as chosen by the operator.



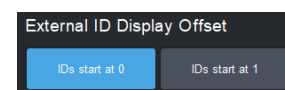
- **Auto-assign**

DashBoard can now be configured to automatically assign an external ID when a preset is created, or upon request.



- **Display offset**

DashBoard can now be configured to offset the displayed external IDs by 1. This can be helpful when working with other systems that also offset preset IDs, such as Carbonite.



- **Preset CUT and RUN commands using external ID**

New commands have been added for custom panel creators to trigger preset recalls using the external ID assigned to the preset.

Hard Panel Control of Preset Recall

DashBoard can now be configured to allow a Hard Panel (such as a joystick controller with assignable buttons) to control preset recalls:

- CUT, RUN or ALT button activation
- HALT a preset recall
- Adjust the run duration of the preset
- A new time mode button that allows the operator to choose whether the hard panel controls run duration prior to preset recall, or time dilation during recall

Note that hard panel control of preset recall will not work when connecting to a PT Head connection that has been shared through the proxy server; a separate connection to the PT Heads should be established from every DashBoard client that requires access to them.

Integration of Paint Control

If the camera mounted on your PT Head is controlled by DashBoard, you can now configure DashBoard to integrate the paint control page into the Ross PT Head UI. This will allow you to view the paint UI as a tab within the PT Head UI and to control paint parameters with a joystick pointed at the PT Head.

This feature is supported for Ross ACIDcam, Hitachi Studio cameras, Panasonic AK-HC1500/HC1800/UB300 and Sony studio cameras that support CNA-1. For Sony and Panasonic cameras, you must have a Ross Video license for the paint control page in order to integrate paint controls into the PT Head UI.

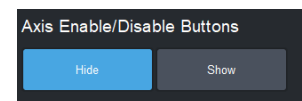

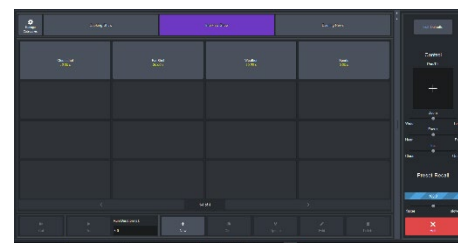

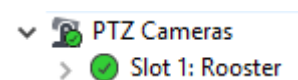

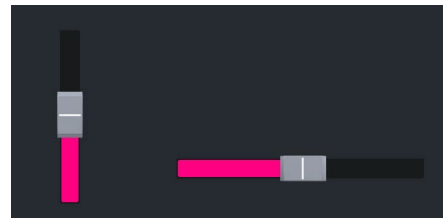

Menu options for adding a new camera to DashBoard have been reconfigured to make them clearer and to distinguish between paint control of ENG/Box cameras and control of PTZ cameras.



- **CONTROL OF ROSS PAN & TILT HEADS**

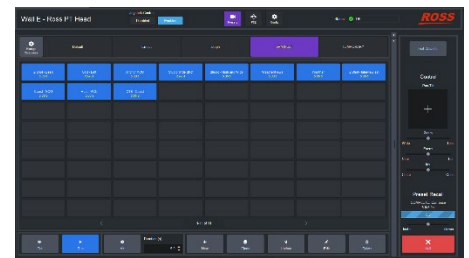
DashBoard now includes a built-in controller for Ross Pan & Tilt Heads (Note: while Furio heads can communicate with DashBoard directly, CamBot heads require the CamBot Protocol Translation software that is part of the Robotics Server to communicate with DashBoard. This software will be available for free for use with the PT head plugin).



To add a PT head in DashBoard, navigate to **File > New > Other > Robots**, and select **Ross PT Head**. The head's IP address is required.

Once connected to a PT Head, the operator can:

- Store, recall, view and manage presets stored on the head. The operator can:
 - View, add, delete, and rename categories.

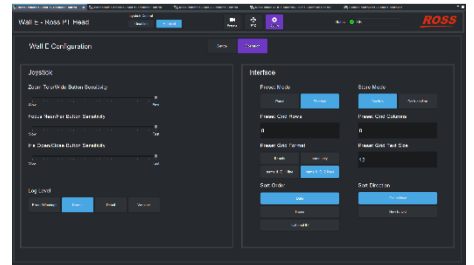
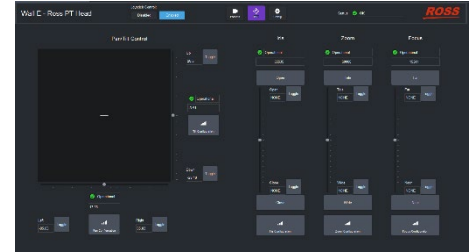


- Directly control pan, tilt, zoom, focus, and iris axes – either through the DashBoard UI or by connecting a standard Microsoft HID-compliant USB joystick to the DashBoard computer.

The operator can:

- Enable and disable joystick control.
 - View axis status and position information
 - Configure axes – speed, damping, and zoom-dependent sensitivity
 - View axis limits. Set and clear soft limits for each axis.
- In addition to providing access to all of the core functionality of the pan & tilt heads, the DashBoard controller also includes some more advanced features that make it easier to use in a variety of workflows:

BUGS ADDRESSED

- Fixed an Ultritouch issue where zip files that contained the same name as a folder caused an error message to appear despite the upload occurring successfully. (DASH-2194)
- Fixed an issue where the tooltip style attribute did not work for the color chooser and color chooser pop-up widget. (DASH-2393)

KNOWN ISSUES

ROLE-BASED ACCESS CONTROL (RBAC)

- **FOR ULTRITOUCH** — When you assign a role permission for an Ultritouch device, currently the device permissions (to read, write or upgrade) may not perform as expected due to differences with the Ultri-touch Management panel. It is recommended that you use both read and write access per-missions to perform administrative actions on the Utritouch Management panel.
- **RPM SERVER CERTIFICATES USING HTTPS** — If you are using an RPM Server that is secured with HTTP Secure, future DashBoard upgrades will require manually adding the RPM Server certificate to DashBoard after the installation process is complete. The upgrade procedure can be found in the DashBoard Role-Based Access Control Guide (85100DR-09A-xxx).
- If a role has any permissions for a card in an openGear frame, that role will also allow users assigned to that role to access any panels that use that card, or any cards in that frame, as a data source. (DBE-835)

NETWORK DEVICE INTERFACE (NDI)

- Limitations for NDI® 5 - DashBoard 9.4 and later support NDI® 5, but not all video codecs are supported for NDI®|HX:
 - Windows version does not support the HEVC codec
 - Linux version does not support the HEVC and H264 codec

AURA THEME

- Due to issues with SVG images, it is currently recommended that you avoid using SVG images within tables, trees, and combo boxes.
- If you are using the Spinner (Hex) widget in DashBoard 9.0+ with a Mac client, you may encounter issues with the text not displaying fully.

ROSTALK EX

- If you use a panel that uses RossTalkEx to send commands to an XPression, and then try to access that XPression's Sequencer View panel, it will fail to load the sequence items. If you open the Sequencer View panel first, and then use your panel you will not encounter any issues.

PAINT CONTROL FOR SONY ENG/BOX CAMERAS

- Upgrading to a new version of DashBoard causes SmartShell to lose connectivity to Sony CNA-1 cameras via the DashBoard proxy server. To re-establish connectivity, open the DashBoard Proxy Server page, make note of the order of the cameras, Unshare all cameras, then Share each camera again in the same order that they were originally shared by right-clicking on each camera in the DashBoard tree and clicking **Share Device**. (CI-190)

PTZ CAMERA CONTROL

- The VISCA gateway for PTZ Cameras provides only a limited implementation of the VISCA protocol and does not include support for most status inquiries including the current value of pan, tilt, zoom and focus axes. Due to this limitation, focus control does not work from Carbonite (when configured to connect to a Sony device) or Acuity switchers when connecting to a PTZ Camera through the DashBoard VISCA gateway. Auto focus is unaffected by this issue and can be set from Carbonite or Acuity. For Carbonite, the recommended workaround is to use the “pivotcam” device configuration when connecting to the DashBoard VISCA gateway. For Acuity, focus must be controlled directly from DashBoard. Other VISCA controllers may encounter similar problems when connecting to the VISCA gateway. The recommended approach is to use a velocity-based control wherever possible (CI-307, CI-189)
- The full range of iris values is not available when controlling iris from Carbonite and Acuity when connecting to a Sony BRC camera through the DashBoard VISCA gateway. This does not affect the range of iris values when the camera is in automatic exposure mode. Workaround is to control iris directly from the DashBoard UI. (CI-188)
- When connecting to a Sony BRC-X1000 camera from DashBoard and switching from manual exposure to auto exposure with no change in exposure settings (iris, shutter, gain) there is a small but noticeable change in light levels in the video SDI output. This appears to be caused by the camera itself. (CI-169).
- Shutting down DashBoard and then immediately restarting it may occasionally result in failure to connect to any PTZ Cameras in the DashBoard tree. If this happens, the recommended resolution is to stop and restart DashBoard, ensuring that it has completely shut down before restarting it. Connectivity problems can also occur if two applications on a workstation are both attempting to connect to VISCA cameras using UDP connections. This could be another instance of DashBoard running the DashBoard PTZ Camera control or a Ross Sony camera custom control panel, or another non-Ross application that also connects to VISCA cameras. To resolve such connectivity problems, shut down all applications connecting to the VISCA cameras and then restart a single instance of DashBoard to connect to all your cameras. Note that it is not possible to run the DashBoard PTZ Camera control alongside a Ross Sony camera custom control panel even if they are hosted on the same instance of DashBoard and connecting to different cameras. (CI-238)

- It is not possible to set the UDP Direct Control Address when configuring the Furio gateway for a PTZ Camera Controller in DashBoard when running on a Linux operating system. If you wish to use the Furio gateway functionality of the PTZ Camera plugin, use of Windows or Mac is required. (CI-739)
- The button for One Push Auto Focus is not properly disabled when Auto Focus is On. This is visual only, so clicking One Push Auto Focus when Auto Focus is On will not impact the camera. (CI-874)
- The wiper controls on the Preset and PTZ pages for the Panasonic AW-HR140 do not have a label – this was done by design. (CI-912)
- The Up and Down buttons for adjusting Color Temperature do not work for Panasonic AW-HR140 cameras when White Balance mode is set to VAR. (CI-924)

SYSTEM CONFIGURATION

- When installing your DashBoard client, if you experience communication issues and are running anti-virus software, consult your I.T. department.

JAVAFX SELECTION ISSUE

- Selecting JavaFX as the browser implementation in DashBoard preferences or directly in the <browser/> tag returns the incorrect browser type on Windows and MacOS. Use of this option should be avoided in DashBoard 9.7.0. (DASH-4639)

MACOS 15 ISSUES

- When disabling JxBrowser in DashBoard Preferences on MacOS 15, DashBoard goes into a restart loop. Disabling JxBrowser on MacOS 15 should be avoided in DashBoard 9.12. (DASH-5130)
- The Ultrix Layout Editor will not load after being closed and reopened on MacOS 15. This issue occurs across DashBoard versions and regardless of DashBoard browser settings. (DASH-5129)
