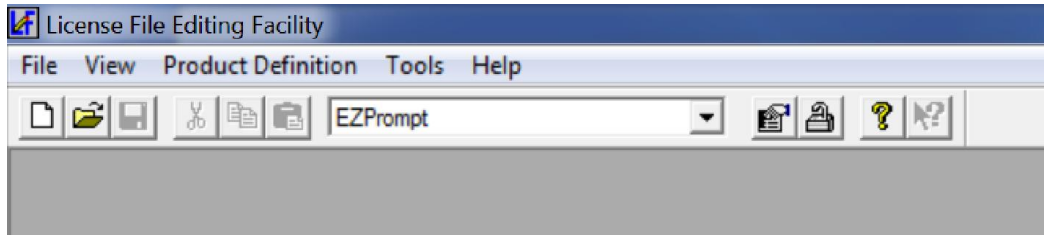
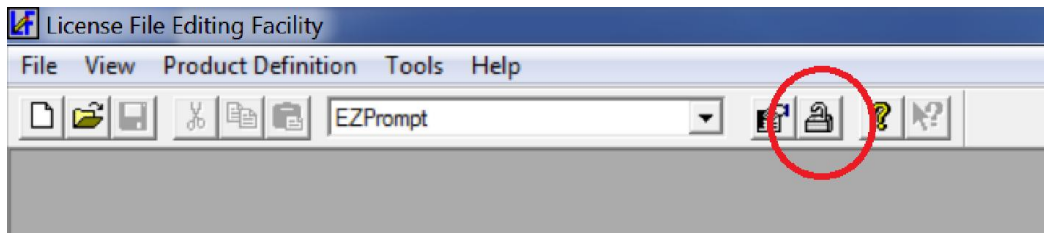


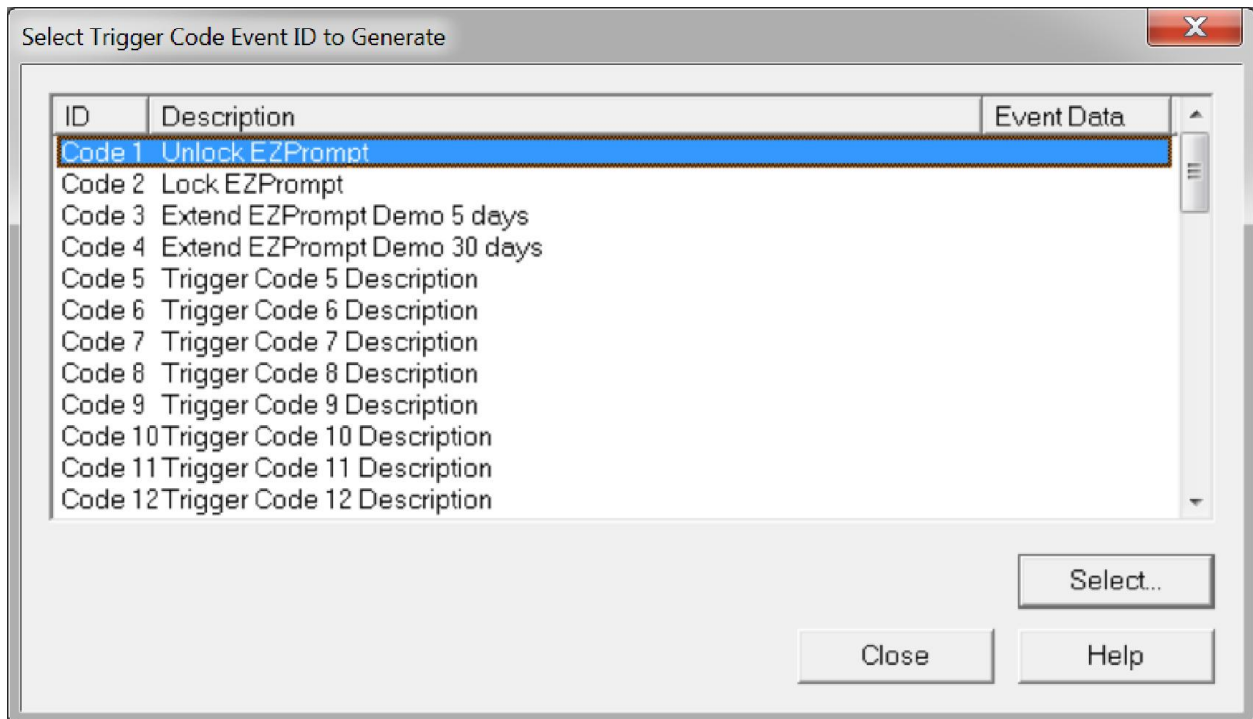
When you open LFEEdit.exe select EZPrompt.



Press the unlock icon to the right of the dropdown.



This shows the following:



You can use the top four Trigger Code options. Extending the Demo for 5 or 30 days will allow users to further evaluate the software or if there is an emergency in the field and their Demo window already expired, it can be extended so they can finish their 'shoot' and straighten any issues regarding the software and machine when they are back in the office.
